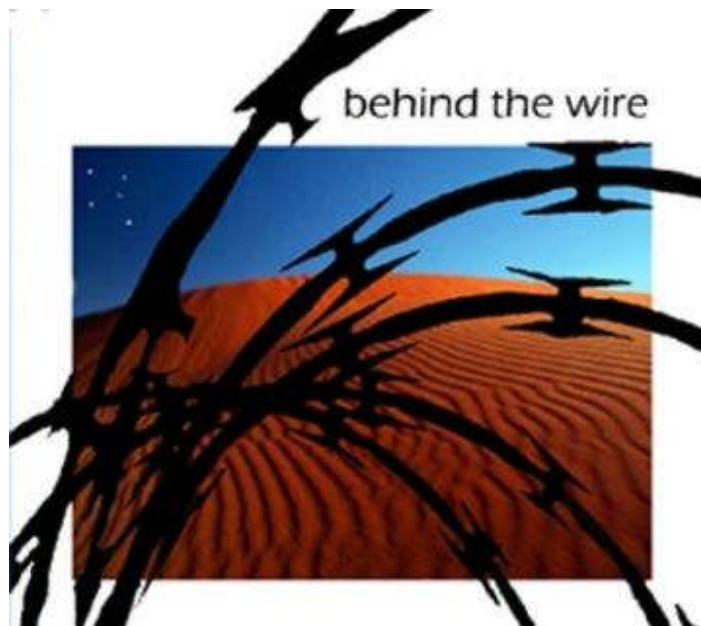
“behind the wire”
