Seasons Greetings

The end of 2005 is drawing near and I would like to take this opportunity to firstly wish you a safe, peaceful and happy holiday season.

I would also like to thank you on behalf of Bridge for Asylum Seekers Foundation (BASF) for your support during this year, which has been both generous and inspiring.

It is at times difficult and disheartening for the members of BASF when we are constantly reminded of the misery inflicted upon asylum seekers by the prevailing policies of our current government. However, through the year we have had many, many bright spots to cheer us and keep us going, and they usually come from you, our supporters.

There has been wonderful support at the events we have held, such as Acoustica in April, Gardens Without Borders on Mothers Day, and the launch of *Another Country* in August. From all of these events, and others

during the year, have come donations, volunteers, friends and pledges of help.

Remembering why we are here, I can report that BASF is currently providing financial assistance to 76 adults and 34 children and youths. These asylum seekers and refugees have fled from the persecution, imprisonment and, in many cases, the torture they suffered in their countries of origin.

All recipients of funds from BASF have a genuine fear for their lives should they be returned to their country of origin.

Among the people we assist are Burmese; Chinese; Africans including Ugandans, Ghanaians, a Zimbabwian, a Nigerian, a Senegalese, and a Sudanese; South Americans; a Korean; Iraqis; Afghanis, Kuwaiti Bedoons, Iranians, Palestinians, a Moroccan; a Vietnamese and Acehnese.

The profile and number of people we support

changes as they receive protection visas, Medicare and work rights. However, at any one time it is typical for BASF to be assisting 100 people, including children.

From August 2003, when we first started to provide funding, to the end of December 2005, BASF will have given over \$350,000 in support to asylum seekers. We plan to give a further \$91,180 to cover the period from the end of December to the end of February 2006.

Once again, I thank all our friends and supporters. As you can see from the figures, we have a task ahead of us to continue to assist those we are already helping, as well as those who are sure to come to us in the future. I trust that we can rely on your continuing support in the new year.
